

## Call for papers for the next issue of CoAst

The next regular issue of Communications in Asteroseismology will be published during the summer of 2008. We invite you to submit your news, articles, and comments about asteroseismology/pulsating stars for the next issue of CoAst. The deadline is *August 15, 2008*. However, because of possible delays caused by refereeing, we request you to submit your paper as early as possible.

Communications in Asteroseismology (CoAst), which incorporates the former Delta Scuti Star Newsletter, is a refereed journal, commissioned by the Austrian Academy of Sciences. CoAst is distributed in printed form. As of early 2007, it can also fully be retrieved online via ADS and Simbad References. This journal is open to all astronomers active in any academic stage of asteroseismology.

Papers should be written in L<sup>A</sup>T<sub>E</sub>X using the standard CoAst files. You can download a zipped package of the style files and the template from the following address: [http://www.univie.ac.at/tops/CoAst/archive/CoAst\\_styles.zip](http://www.univie.ac.at/tops/CoAst/archive/CoAst_styles.zip). If you have previously downloaded this package before April, 2008, we kindly ask you to download the new version of this package, which incorporates some major updates. The references should have the format given in the template file. Figures should preferably be in Postscript or .jpg. Please enclose a Postscript or PDF version of your paper when submitting your contribution. If you have any pictures related to your contribution that might be suitable for the cover page, please provide them as well.

If you intend to publish in the next issue, please send a short message to CoAst editorial office. This will not obligate you in any way. The complete paper (.tex file, figures in .eps or .jpg, as well as your postscript or .pdf output) should be submitted to *Comm.Astro@univie.ac.at*. If the submission of your manuscript was successful, you will receive confirmation within a few days.
